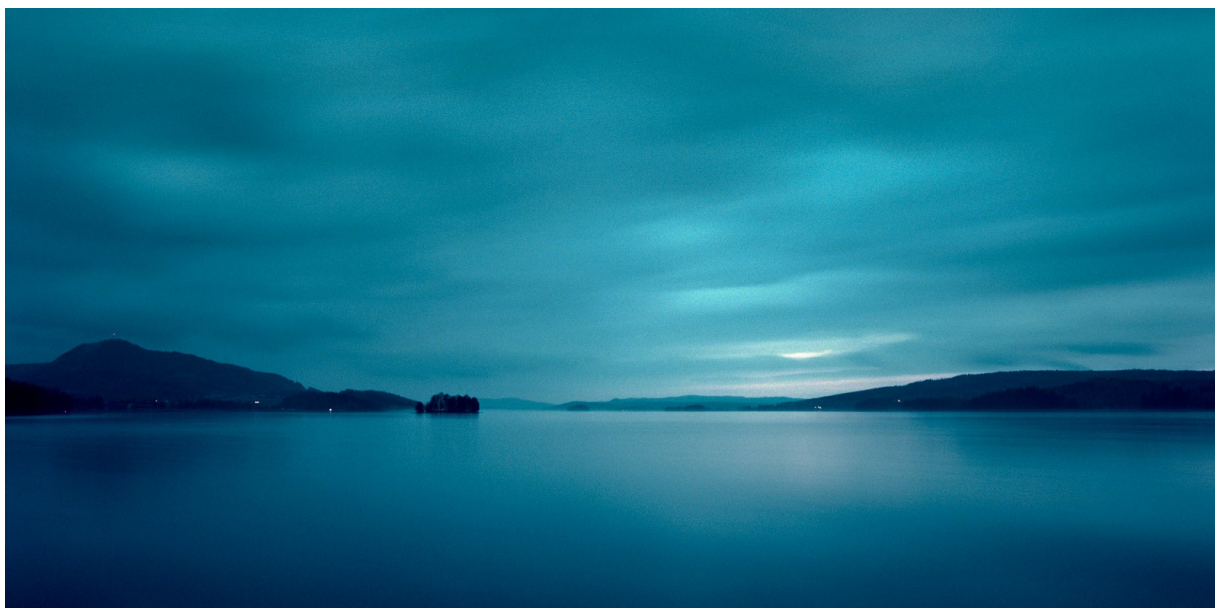


INVITATION TO SEMINAR ON IPCC SPECIAL REPORT
